

## WEGMEYER FARMS PLANTS “CROP FOR A CAUSE”, DONATES \$10,000 to UKRAINE RELIEF EFFORTS

JULY 21, 2022 – HAMILTON – Wegmeyer Farms grew it’s first “Crop for a Cause” and raised \$10,000 for Samaritan’s Purse for its humanitarian efforts in Ukraine. The Wegmeyer’s grew six acres of sunflowers for customers to pick and use as a photo backdrop, and committed 100 percent of proceeds to Samaritan’s Purse.

“When seeing the horror happening to the people of Ukraine, we wanted to do something,” said Harriet Wegmeyer. “We had the land and decided we could do something! Farming is something that we love, but growing a crop for people who need so much took it to a whole new level.”

A former Wegmeyer Farms team member, Abby McDonough, works for Samaritan’s Purse and is currently providing humanitarian relief to the people of Ukraine.

Wegmeyer Farms looks forward to continuing its effort of growing a “Crop for a Cause” in the years ahead.
